ITFS 2021 - The Highlights on Wednesday, May 5

Press Release, Stuttgart, May 4, 2021

Since May 3, animation fans, film lovers and professionals have been able to watch an extensive film programme with animated short and feature films as well as many other events via Online+ and OnlinePro on <u>OnlineFestival.ITFS.de</u>. The free ITFS Live Stream on <u>OnlineFestival.ITFS.de</u> offers a rich film programme for both young and old every day from May 4. Here come the highlights for Wednesday, 5 May 2021.

Tonight, Tuesday, May 4, at 19:00 pm (CET), the ITFS will be officially opened (via Online+) with a presentation on the highlights of the 2021 Festival programme. The makers of the competition films presented during the opening – including Gil Alkabetz and Jalal Maghout – will be live in the studio, onsite or digitally. Guests will include Winfried Kretschmann, Prime Minister of the Federal State of Baden-Württemberg, and Stuttgart's Mayor Isabel Fezer, Department of Youth and Education, either digitally via video message or live in the studio. Afterwards, the opening reception will take place digitally in the ITFS VR Hub at 20:30 pm (CET), musically accompanied by Linda & Andrew.

From Wednesday, 5 May, 12:00 noon (CET), the programme of the International Competition 1 is available in the Media Library. Included are the films "I'm Here" (Julia Orlik, Poland 2020) and "Obervogelgesang" (Ferdinand Ehrhardt, Elisabeth Weinberger, Malin Krüger, Germany 2020) – both nominated for the Lotte Reininger Promotion Award. Already available online since May 4 are the Out of Competition feature films "Pos Eso" (Sam, Spain 2014), "Trash" (Francesco Dafano, Luca Della Grotta, Italy 2020) and "George The Hedgehog" (Wojtek Wawszczyk, Tomek Lesniak, Jakub Tarkowski, Poland 2011).

The <u>talk "Creating*Diversity"</u> aims to discuss the current state of the topic of diversity in the industry and will take place at **11:00 am (CET)** via Zoom.

At **19:00 pm (CET**), the five nominated games of the Animated Games Award Germany and their creators will be presented at the **MFG Open Stage Games BW** in cooperation with MFG Medienund Filmgesellschaft Baden-Württemberg mbH, the state's funding institution.



Studio and school presentations come from the German-French studio <u>Laïdak Films</u>, from <u>Ulysses</u> and from the <u>Bauhaus University Weimar</u>.

A screenplay workshop on <u>Immersive storytelling for VR animation</u> with French Digital Rise founder **François Klein** will take place as early as **10:00 am (CET)**.



At **14:00 pm (CET**), the free panel <u>Always Look on the Bright Side – How Lockdown Measures Accelerate</u>

<u>Chances for Women in Animation</u> (in cooperation with the Women's Initiative of AG Animationsfilm) will discuss what has changed in the animation industry in the last year, especially from the perspective of women, and what advantages the new technological developments bring.

At **16:00 pm (CET)**, <u>Virtual Worlds – YULLBE and the Future of VR</u> will be about immersive storytelling using the example of the location-based VR attraction YULLBE and about the development process of this new form of entertainment.

The <u>Master Class: The Ambersons Project: Animated Restoration</u> at **18:00 pm (CET)** uses the example of Orson Welles' film "The Magnificent Ambersons" to explain how to reconstruct lost film material with animated sequences.
