

28th Stuttgart International Festival of Animated Film (ITFS)

ITFS 2021 – The Highlights on Thursday, May 6

Press Release, Stuttgart, May 5, 2021

ONLINE PRO

From Thursday, 6 May, 12:00 CET, the programme of the International Competition 2 will be available in the Media Library on OnlineFestival.ITFS.de, including newly discovered Liesbet van Loon's "Monachopsis" (Belgium 2020) which shows the feeling of exclusion, of not belonging, until the protagonist meets a woman with whom she feels a strong connection; as well as "Altötting" (Andreas Hykade, Germany, Canada, Portugal 2020) and "Empty Places" (Geoffroy de Crécy, France 2020) – an ode to the melancholy of machines. Also, the Young Animation Competition 1 entries can be viewed from 12:00 CET, including "Le sourire de la courgette" (Lucas Ansart, France 2020) and "Je suis un caillou" (Mélanie Berteraut-Platon, Yasmine Bresson, Léo Coulombier, Nicolas Grondin, Maxime Le Chapelain, Louise Massé, France 2020). The first part of the Tricks for Kids Competition is also now available online, including "Warm Star" (Anna Kuzina, Russia 2020) and "Mishou" (Milen Vitanov, Germany, Bulgaria 2020) about four lively polar bunnies whose lives change abruptly when they discover a strange creature.

An **international premiere** in Stuttgart will be the feature film <u>"City of Lost Things"</u> (**Yee Chih-Yen**, Taiwan 2020) in the **AniMovie Competition**.

In keeping with the **country focus on France**, <u>Animation Around Europe</u>: <u>Voices Of French Animation 2</u> – the second part of the programme already shown on Wednesday – presents film programmes by female directors who have shaped the history of French animation, on **Thursday**, **19:00-0:00 CET**, including **Regina Pessoa**'s award-winning **"Uncle Thomas: Accounting for the Days"** (Canada, France, Portugal 2019).

Studio and school presentations come from **monströös**, **Sacrebleu**, the **China Academy of Art** and the **Hochschule Luzern**.

Already at **10:00 CET**, there will be the **Master Class "Anidox meets Indie Online"** presented by ANIDOX producer **Michelle Kranot**, about the award-winning animated documentary **"Just a Guy" by Shoko Hara**, who will also be joining.

In the **Lecture** about the course <u>Aardman Academy Stop Motion 1</u> at **18:00 CET, Mark Simon Hewis**, the head of the Aardman Academy will talk through curriculum including virtual lessons and weekly one-on-one mentor tutorials with an individually assigned Aardman professional who will act as guidance, offering advice throughout.

At the <u>Animation Production Days</u>, an joint venture by ITFS and FMX – Conference on Animation, Effects, Games and Immersive Media, the <u>Conference Part 1: Enable! Case Studies and Market Trends</u> takes place on **Thursday**, **6 May**, at 15:00 CET.

GameZone:

Under the motto <u>"Edutain Me 7.0 - Games as educational material in the digital classroom"</u> (14:00-18:00 CET, ITFS Studio Stream, then available as VOD on the GameZone Edu page at OnlineFestival.ITFS.de), developers, publishers, representatives from higher education and training as well as politicians will discuss how games can be used effectively in the classroom. Among other things, the project "Digital Ways into the Museum" will be presented using the example of Natureworld (Stuttgart State Museum of Natural History) as well as the use of games in the



classroom. In addition, the GameZone site will provide games for the classroom as well as around ten serious games to try out. After the panel, there will be a **digital get-together** in the **ITFS VR Hub from 18:00 CET**.

ITFS Live-Stream and ITFS Studio-Stream

The ITFS Live Stream begins, like every day, at 14:00 CET. The feature highlight "Heidi" (Alan Simpson, Germany, United Kingdom, Canada 2005) can be seen there at 15:00 CET. In addition, Susanne Walter from the Kolping-Bild-ungswerk Württemberg will talk about the Education Partnership with the ITFS in an interview at 17:00 CET. The programme is enhanced by daily series highlights such as Studio 100's "Maya the Bee" and "Alice in Wonderland" as well as Cartoon Network's "Victor and Valentino" and "Craig of the Creek".
